CALUMET COUNTY CLEAN SWEEP & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY

Enclosed with this newsletter, please find information regarding Calumet County's annual Clean Sweep Program and Electronics collection event. They will be holding the event of Friday May 18th from 3 p.m. - 6 p.m. at the New Holstein Public Works garage and on Saturday May 19th from 8 a.m. - 11 a.m. at the Town of Harrison garage. There will be a small charge of \$1 for each piece of electronics. The village did invest funds to help keep this valuable program going due to funding cuts that it suffered. Please mark your calendars and don't miss out on this great event.

YARD WASTE

Please remember that at the compost site, only yard waste and brush can be disposed of there on their proper piles. This area is not a dumping ground for other materials such as concrete, brick, garbage, etc. If you have concrete material that needs to be disposed of, it can be done at the wastewater treatment plant by appointment. We recycle the concrete there and use the recycled material as base in our projects. Please contact the clerk's office to make arrangements. Also please remember to keep all grass clippings out of the roads as the weather starts to warm up and we begin to think about cutting our lawns again. It is against current ordinance. If you mistakenly blow grass into the road, we ask that you clean it up promptly. If not, we will clean it up and you would be billed accordingly.

SPRING CLEAN

The annual Spring Clean will again be held this year. The board decided to conduct the program in the same manner as was done last year. We will be having the drop off site again in the gravel parking lot across the street from the fire station/community center. Items will not be picked up at the curbing. The event is scheduled for Saturday, May 5th from 8 a.m. - 11 a.m. No material will be picked up if it is left out on the curb area. Based upon the net costs of last year, it made the decision easy for the village board to continue with this practice. The net cost of the spring clean last year was \$55.88 compared to \$2,017.90 the year before. Although the total tonnage was down, the board felt that this event went much better because it was cleaner and more efficient. Following is the list of acceptable and non-acceptable items:

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR COLLECTION

- *Household items such as couches, chairs, tables, lamps, sinks and toilets.
- *Carpeting, rugs, pads from carpeting. All carpeting/pad material should be cut down to 4' lengths and tied for ease of handling.
- *Bedsprings, mattresses, bed frames, swing sets and wash line poles (with concrete removed from the poles) and bicycles.
- *Freon free appliances (i.e. washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, water softeners and dishwashers).
- *Any NON-HAZARDOUS household refuse that is bagged or bundled.
- *Scrap Metals. Enclosed is a listing of accepted and non-accepted scrap metals.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR COLLECTION

- *No refrigerators, freezers or dehumidifiers under any circumstances, even if the freon has been removed.
- *No microwaves.
- *No E-Waste, such as computers, monitors, any computer accessories, televisions, VCR/DVD/DVR players, telephones, fax machines or any electronic item.
- *No residential recycling items.
- *No gasoline-powered engines.
- *No construction and remodeling debris (such as plaster, shingles, siding). These items require a dumpster.
- *No yard waste
- *No fluorescent light bulbs and household hazardous materials (chemicals, paints, spray cans, etc.)
- *No tires or batteries.

FOR LARGE CONTAINERS, call 920-849-1450, Ext. 3 to arrange a pick-up. If the items you wish to dispose are not listed or you are unsure if the items are hazardous or dangerous, please call 920-849-1473 ahead of time.

Wastes must be brought in the original containers, 5 gallons or less in size whenever possible. Keep materials separate. Do NOT mix chemicals. To transport materials, place them in a box or other sturdy container to prevent spills or breakage. **CONTAINERS ARE NOT RETURNED.**

CLEAN SWEEP FOR BUSINESSES

Qualifying businesses are eligible to participate in the Clean Sweep program, although they must pay the full cost for material disposal. Contact UW Extension at 920-849-1450, Ext. 3 (in the Appleton area call 920-989-2700, Ext. 288) for information on scheduling an appointment.

COMPUTERS AND ELECTRONICS

Household computer and electronics items will be accepted according to the following fee schedule:

\$1.00 per piece: televisions, computer monitors, laptops, CPU's, fax machines, printers, photocopiers, VCR, DVD players, cell phones.

CASH ONLY!

No Checks or Plastic

NO CHARGE for peripherals: keyboards, mice, speakers, wires, docking stations, and scanners.

Proof of Calumet County residency required.

FREE DISPOSAL OF THESE ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

- Plant, pest, yard maintenance chemicals
- Oil-based paints, solvents, and related products— **NO LATEX PAINT!**
- Cleaners and cleansers
- Automotive and vehicle products ***Keep waste oil separate to be recycled.***
- Mercury and other products—Bulk mercury and mercury containing devices such as thermometers and thermostats, tube fluorescent bulbs, button cell (**NOT HOUSEHOLD**) batteries, acids and bases, and photographic chemicals.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

These items require special handling and will not be accepted. For proper disposal please contact UW Extension.

- Radioactive Material (smoke detectors)
- Explosives
- Ammunition
- Rechargeable batteries
- Compressed Gas Tanks/Propane tanks
- CFL Light Bulbs (the curly ones)
- Latex Paint

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Prohibited Items

**TO COMPLY WITH FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS AND/OR
REGULATIONS, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING UNLESS OTHERWISE
SPECIFIED WITH SPECIAL INSTRUCTION**

CAPACITORS OR CAPACITOR BEARING MATERIALS:

BALLASTS OR ITEMS CONTAINING BALLASTS (PCB or NOT)

LIGHT BULBS

SEALED UNITS: Including but not limited to propane tanks, Freon tanks, hydraulic cylinders, air tanks, and units under pressure or containing oils.

**Units are accepted if cut open and properly cleaned*

COMPRESSED GAS & OXYGEN BOTTLES:

**Bottles will be accepted if drained, properly cleaned and one end has been removed.*

LP TANKS:

**Will be accepted if tanks are completely purged and/or shot blasted to remove all residual chemicals and cut in half*

GAS TANKS:

**Will be accepted only if they are STEEL, drained, punched with a minimum of 6 holes on each side, separate on a load, and arrangement has been made in advance with a Saddoff buyer.*

MICROWAVE OVENS

TELEVISION SETS/COMPUTER MONITORS

TIRES: Saddoff reserved the right to charge for the handling of tires mixed in a scrap load.

NICKEL-CADMIUM, LITHIUM, ABSOLYTE BATTERIES

UNSPENT AIRBAG CANISTERS

DIRT/SOILS
