FROM THE VILLAGE BOARD--Highlights of the July Board Meeting:

## The village board approved the following:

- To set the public hearing for a proposed amendment to the zoning code. The public hearing is scheduled for August 8<sup>th</sup> @ 7 p.m. for Ordinance 2017\_03 to create Section 9.01(7D) of the Code of Ordinances and Ordinance 2017\_04 to create Section 9.01(8B) of the Code of Ordinances pertaining to roof top signs.
- To hire an arborist at a cost of up to \$500 to inspect tree damage.
- The application for operator's licenses for Shambhu Lamichhane and Stacey Elliott.
- To renew the employee health insurance for 8/1/17.
- Request from the First Responders to plant a tree at the ballfield in memory of Lisa VandenElzen.
- The rebidding of certain paving projects in 2017 and have the village employees do the curb/gutter and storm sewer work.

## The village received notice of the following:

- Receipt of Quarterly Street Aid Payment in the amount of \$12,292.82.
- The condition of budgets for all funds as of 6/30/2017.
- The 2016 audit report for the village presented by the auditors stating that the village has about a year's worth of fund balance which puts us in strong financial shape and a healthy balance in our capital improvements fund for future capital expenditures.
